- * Yearbook orders are now in for the 100 page spread at a cost of \$15. The cost to print the yearbook is just over \$15. Thank you to Mrs. Smith and the Yearbook Committee for a job well done.
- * Gr. 3 and Gr. 6 EQAO is now finished. Our students did their very best and the school as a whole worked well to optimize testing conditions.
